

SE Park and Pipe Pathway Manager (Manchester Area) - contract for services 0.5, fixed term 1 year

Role Introduction

Snowsport England have secured partnership funding and resources to set up a Talent Environment in Manchester. Centred around Chill Factor & Graystone Action Sport, we are looking for an individual with a unique skill set who understands the components of creating 'Talent Environments' in relation to on and off-snow progression, that can also link other extreme sports in this domain. While we want this job to predominantly develop world class talent in Park and Pipe, if we develop athletes with other skillsets such as video editing, sport specific judges/official, coaches and instructors then this will also be seen as a success. We realise that without links to the local community and harnessing their resources to the project, we will not be able to develop sustainable world class talent and world class participation pathways. We have the ability to be unique, have world class athletes and world class participation, training collaboratively within a free sports culture.

This is an exciting opportunity for a role overseen by a management board, (Snowsport England, Sport Aid & GB Snowsports), to develop something highly creative, collaborative and sustainable. The role will include a budget to employ sport specific Park and Pipe coaches to work domestically and abroad to develop athletes achieve their planned goals.

Role Job Description

- Set up a Talent Environment that allows individuals to develop and progress onto the SE Home Nation Programme and ultimately GB Park and Pipe
- Interface with other Olympic and Paralympic Sports to provide a cross training environments for athletes to progress
- Develop a talent environment that reaches out to the local community to develop world class participation pathways.
- Report back to the Management Board on agreed outcomes and monitoring templates in a timely manner.
- To work within an agreed budget set by the Management Board
- To bring in income (financial and in kind) from various sources to add to the generation and progress of the talent environment
- To have a comprehensive understanding on how to promote a talent environment

- Strong links with the Greater Manchester Area
- Experience of delivering youth programmes
- Good logistical skillset
- Good communication in person and electronically
- A genuine energy to work with young active free sport
