

Code of Conduct – Members

Snowsport England and its affiliated clubs expect the highest standards of all its members, participating in Snowsport. All are to be mindful of the following and must: -

- Display high standards of behaviour
- Not use inappropriate language or gestures, including foul, sexist, abusive, racist, or prejudicial language or tolerate it from others
- Not condone, or allow to go unchallenged, any form of discrimination if witnessed
- Conduct themselves in a manner that takes all reasonable steps to protect their own safety and that of others
- Promote the positive aspects of snowsport and fair play
- Encourage all participants to respect Snowsport England staff, volunteers, and officials
- Recognise good performance and not just good results
- Place the well-being and safety of the child above the development of performance
- Respect children's opinions when making decisions about their participation in Snowsport
- Abide by Snowsport England's Policies (please see SE company Rules and Regulations)
- Understand that any breach of SE Policies may result in disciplinary action
- Not use the internet or social media to make derogatory remarks about other people involved in snowsport, SE regions or clubs, or anything related to snowsport that could be interpreted as wrong, unkind or that could bring the sport into disrepute
